Ceramic destinations for a study tour

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Offer 1:

The European ceramic scene is very diverse and combines different ceramic traditions. From famous Faïence of the Faenza region in Italy, the well-known Bunzlau pottery in Poland and Gmundner ceramics or Augarten Porzellanmanufaktur Wien in Austria to the cradle of European porcelain in Germany and the ceramic scene in Slovenia the regions participated within CerDee are linked through their riche ceramics history, which can be discovered and experienced in many different ways. This guide lists the different offers divided by country and by regions.

Austria

Austria has a long tradition in ceramics and there are still some manufactories alive, like the Gmundner Keramik manufactory, where the tradition goes back about 500 years, or the two oldest Porcelain Manufactory of Europe, founded in 1718, located in Augarten Porzellanmanufaktur Wien in Vienna. In different areas of Austria, you can find ceramics tradition in the cities and manufactories.

Lower Austria

Scheibbs

Werkstätte Scheibbser Keramik

In 1923, the Viennese Ludwig Weinbrenner founded the Tonindustrie Scheibbs in a former hammer mill in the north of the city. Many of the designs and glazes of that time suggest a close connection with the ceramic art of the Wiener Werkstätte.

Today, the Scheibbser Keramik produces mainly everyday objects such as wall plates, coffee cups or jugs by hand. The production is carried out by people with disabilities and their companions.

Wilhelmsburg

Geschirrmuseum Wilhelmsburg

Almost dedicated to decay, this historic building has been brought back to life by being converted into a museum. This is thanks to the private initiative and a lot of heart and soul of the Wilhelmsburg master locksmith Manfred Schönleitner, who himself is very familiar with the ceramics industry.

Vienna

Augarten Porcelain Manufactory and the MAK (Museum of Applied Arts)

Some museums have numerous ceramic or porcelain exhibits, such as the Imperial Silver Collection in the Hofburg and the MAK (Museum of Applied Arts).

The "Wiener Augarten" have the oldest baroque park in the heart of Vienna. Since May 1718 there is produced the "white gold" until today in line with the traditional methods. Click <u>here</u> for more information.

Gmunden

Gmundner Manufactory and Museum Gmunden, Ceramik and Art:

In addition to a short film, some particularly valuable exhibits, a touch and a photo station, you will receive detailed insights into the creation of the unique Gmunden ceramics. From turning, glazing, painting, flaming and firing - experience how much love and craftsmanship Gmundner Keramik is made with.

As of the early 20th century Franz und Emilie Schleiß had been working with internationally reputed artists. Together, they significantly contributed to the arts-and-crafts of the Viennese Art Nouveau. Since these days' various efforts attempted to preserve this heritage and to strengthen the links between art and pottery. in the 1960s, Gmunden hosted the "International Symposia on Ceramics". Since 2003 these events have had a revival in the newly established "Keramiksymposium Gmunden".

The Czech Republic can look back on 200 years of porcelain tradition. In Czech Republic the first porcelain manufactory was founded in 1794 in a small city called Klášterec nad Ohří near Karlovy Vary. Named of one former owner, Count František Thun. Until today they still produce in this manufactory.

Loket

Loket Castle (Hrad Loket)

A rich collection of porcelain of 19th and 20th century is the unique jewel of the castle expositions. The porcelain was made in Loket's, Horni Slavkov's and other local factories.

Viennese spa goblets, made during the turn of 18th and 19th century, belong to the most precious showpieces, as well as painted porcelain pipe heads or the very first piece ever made in the Loket porcelain factory.

Visitors can also view the glass products of the famous glass factory of Moser, based in Karlovy Vary.

A collection of porcelain from the 19th and 20th centuries, which was made in porcelain factories in Loket, Horní Slavkov and elsewhere. Exposition also includes Viennese spa cups from the turn of the





18th and 19th centuries, hand-painted porcelain pipe heads or the first product from the Loket porcelain factory.

Germany

Germany is the cradle of European porcelain. Re-invented at the beginning of the 18th century in Dresden, Europe's first porcelain manufactory, the Porzellanmanufaktur Meissen, shows its craftsmanship in its museum as well as many other porcelain manufactures and museums in Thuringia and porcelain factories and museums in Bavaria.

Selb

Porzellanikon Selb

The Porzellanikon Selb is located in a former Rosenthal factory which closed down in 1969. With its imposing chimneys and its ensemble of buildings huddled together like a castle complex, the site very much has the feel of a well-fortified labyrinth. One particularly interesting architectural feature at the Porzellanikon is the fact that six of the ten former giant circular kilns remained intact and visitors can actually walk around inside them.

In Hohenberg an der Eger, Porzellanikon's parent building with 2,000 sqm of exhibition space in the former Director's Villa of the family-owned company C. M. Hutschenreuther, you can discover the cultural history of porcelain from the time it was invented by Johann Friedrich Böttger and Ehrenfried Walther von Tschirnhaus. Get more information here.

GRASSI Museum of Applied Arts

The museum is one of Europe's leading houses of design and applied arts. The changing exhibitions range from arts and crafts to design, photography and architecture. Here, the historical is intertwined with the contemporary. At the centre of the tastefully designed permanent exhibition are styles such as Art Nouveau, Art Deco and Bauhaus. Currently, the extensive collection consists of approximately 230,000 pieces' representative of European and international artisanship dating back to antiquity to the present day. The Museum of the Meissen Porcelain Foundation displays works from the manufactory's 300 years of history. The collection tells the rich story of Europe's oldest porcelain manufactory.

The city of Faenza became the centre of ceramics in Italy. It also embossed the definition of Faïence ceramic. Already at the beginning of the 14th century the production starts in this area.

International Museum of Ceramics (MIC)

Visit the International Museum of Ceramics (the most important one in Italy!) and an artisanal workshop where you can see real ceramists at work.

MIC represents the most important collection in the world and a real cultural center dedicated to ceramics. MIC heritage consists of over 60,000 works dating from 4000 years bc to the present day. It houses a restoration workshop, a library, photographic and documentary archives and an educational workshop. The library is a precious reference point for researchers, scholars, artists, students and art critics. It owns about 68,000 volumes and pamphlets dedicated to ceramics and art in general. It also houses the Ceramic Photo Library, commissioned by the MIC founder Gaetano Ballardini in 1927,





as a tool for the iconographic documentation of ceramic works held in public and private collections all over the world.

Stroll in the old town center through its elegant piazza, the Duomo, the Palazzo Comunale and the Neoclassic Museum (Museo dell'Età Neoclassica) in Romgna. For more information visit the <u>website</u>.

City of Faenza

Faenza is the city of ceramics, known around the world for its precious handmade and painted majolica using ancient techniques that were made famous during the renaissance. The great reenactment of the Palio di Niballo, also going back to the days of the Renaissance, takes place every year at the end of June in the 5 Rioni (districts of a town) in which the city is divided.

The website "Imola Faenza" touristic office based in Romagna, is free to adapt its touristic proposals to any request coming from private citizens or institutions. For people interested in ceramics it is an opportunity to ask for specific tours. In particular ceramic entrepreneurs may analyse how a territory can offer job opportunities. If the tourism interested in ceramics works, then it is possible to hypothesize the creation of a production, sales or promotion activities. Slovenia

The material clay has embossed Slovenia for its creative work many centuries ago and are the basis of its development of pottery centres. In the small city Kamnik the tradition of potteries goes back until the 19th century. Since 1911 they are producing the Fayence technique - the well-known product is the "Majolika of Kamnik". Also the village of Filovci combines the traditional crafts, like pottery, the indigenous architecture, like the Pannonian house and the cultural heritage.

National Museum of Slovenia

National Museum of Slovenia preserves the largest ceramics collection in Slovenia. They present it at permanent collection, various temporary exhibitions and at various educational workshops. They organize UNICUM - international triennial of ceramics (next edition in 2023)

Countryceramics studio by Živa located in Besnica, in the outskirts of Kranj, is an architect who discovered her passion in clay design. She promotes pottery in the region, conducts workshops and designs unique clay products. Sometimes she goes to nature and collects autochthonous Slovenian clay, from which she bakes interesting products in her own oven. In collaboration with Tourist and culture board Kranj are preparing the concept of co-working space studio, since there is an option for tourists to stay overnight. The House of Ceramics in Kamnik was established to preserve a special kind of painted creamware that was produced by Kamnik ceramics factory (now closed for many years). The painters from the factory are working there as volunteers. Awaits you with stories about the Kamnik majolica. The open studio is a gathering place for pottery lovers where you can see in person the so-called Kamnik creamware and the traditional ways of its painting. At the House of Ceramics, ceramic products are produced in the same way as they were since 1855 at the Kamnik factory of ETI SVIT. You can view the whole process at open workshops. At the House you can also order products tailored to your preferences and arrange to participate in a workshop or a course. Combine your visit to the House of Ceramics, where you can buy pottery with tours of the most beautiful part of Kamnik - Šutna, the historical street of artisans and traders.

The Preseren fair (8th February) in Kranj

On the day of the death of the greatest Slovenian poet France Prešeren, Slovenians celebrate a national day of culture. Since France Prešeren spent his last years in Kranj, Kranj is also called Prešeren's town. On this day, The tourist and culture board Kranj hosts one of the largest cultural events in the country, attracting more than 20,000 visitors each year - The Prešeren Fair. During the walk through the streets and squares of the city visitors can attend and buy at the Arts and Crafts Fair.
