ANALYSED DOCUMENTS

- Documentation on 12 pilot actions (FORGET HERITAGE, RESTAURA)
- Output factsheets, pilot summaries, external evaluation report, final reports on implementation, final evaluation + additional project and other documentation

MAIN CONCLUSIONS

- Big differences in terms of size, context, focus (project activities, thematic/content related)
- Project documentation of various quality (information, language)
- Pilots as useful tool for testing new models and concepts of heritage revitalisation
- There are some recommendations which are more generally applicable





SELECTED METHOD FOR TOOL PREPARATION

- → New document needed
- Short, transparent, understandable
- Widely applicable recommendations based on good and not-so-good practices
- Short, clear overview of basic information about pilots





DEFINITION AND IMPORTANCE OF THE TOPIC

Pilot projects:

Represent a practical implementation and test of developed tools. They have an experimental or demonstration character, which means that they should test, evaluate or demonstrate the feasibility and effectiveness of a novel solution, unprecedented in a comparable environment (Interreg CE, 2019. Application manual for the fourth call).

Importance for effective management of CH sites:

- Enable testing of new CH revitalisation approaches
- Provide excellent opportunity for learning and accumulation of first-hand experience (mistakes allowed)
- Raise awareness about the new approaches







CONTENT

- Summarizes experience from past pilot actions
- Provides a more transparent overview of good practices
- Recommendations applicable to a wider or clearly specified context

STRUCTURE

- 1.) Introduction
- 2.) Recommendations:
- General principles to follow
- According to basic stages of the project life cycle: project initiation, project planning, project implementation, project closing
- 3) Overview of the analysed pilots (APPENDIX)





MAIN CHALLENGES, ISSUES ...

Each pilot (past & future) is a story of its own

→ Applicability issues possible despite general recommendations

Recommendations do not cover all necessary steps for pilot project implementation (NOT a Management manual!)

- → Additional literature on project management needs to be used
- → References to other ForHeritage tools on specific topic

Document as a good starting point, further knowledge and first-hand experience irreplaceable!

→ Importance of pilot actions!
