GET STARTED RIGHT AWAY

The TRANS-BORDERS project was successfully launched in the second half of this year. After an initial consultation meeting last June, all parties involved met for the first joint partner meeting in Dresden. The Saxon State Ministry of Economic Affairs, Labour and Transport had invited to this event. In his speech welcoming the participants, State Secretary Dr. Hartmut Mangold underlined the increasing importance of cross-border transport links for public transport, especially in the areas between the European transport corridors and their nodes. The participants agreed on close cooperation to achieve the project's goals and were able to come up with initial solutions during the course of the meeting.

And what will TRANS-BORDERS deal with in the near future?

TRANS-BORDERS starts with regional analyses of cross-border traffic in the project regions, which are the border triangle Poland-Czech Republic-Germany as well as the border region South Carinthia and Koroška, which is an Austrian-Slovenian border region. The first results of the analyses will be available in the beginning of 2018.

WHAT'S UP FOR 2018

We will report regularly on the progress of the project. Following the regional analyses of the overall status of cross-border links in the project regions, two transnational workshops will take place in spring 2018. TRANS-BORDERS will first organize and hold a best practice workshop in Villach (Austria). Another workshop is aimed at stakeholders in cross-border public transport, which will take place in Liberec (Czech Republic).
