1. SKUHNA

PROGRAMME SUMMARY

Skuhna is a social enterprise that runs a restaurant providing authentic food from Africa, Asia and South America. The project's goals are two-fold: to increase the employability of migrants through culinary work and to bridge the understanding gap between migrants and locals who live in Slovenia. Migrants prepare food from their various countries of origin and present it to potential customer base of people willing to taste it. In addition, the migrants have the opportunity to tell their own stories, which is an important tool in intercultural education. Skuhna isn't just about food, it is about the stories of the food, the people who prepare it, the countries it comes from, and also the pots that are used. It is all about the story. While empowering migrants, Skuhna is also about enlightening people to diverse realities through food, migrant empowerment and global education.



PROGRAMME SUMMARY

SKUHNA creates work opportunities for individuals with limited access to the Slovenian labour market due to limited knowledge of the Slovene language. In addition, the project provides support and training in a workplace setting which enables overall growth and improvement for migrants. Currently, SKUHNA is the only migrant restaurant in Slovenia that combines food from all around the world in one place. People with different statuses have the opportunity to work there such as asylum seekers, refugees, undocumented migrants and local citizens.





2. HUMAN LIBRARY - ŽIVA KNJIŽNICA

TIMELINE Launched 2018

CATEGORY Social Integration

PROGRAMME SUMMARY

The method of the Human Library confronts the 'readers' with their own prejudices and stereotypical images and offers a concrete opportunity of face-to-face meeting with their own stereotypes. The 'books' in human library are actual representatives of different minorities, socially deprived groups or people that are facing prejudices in their lives, and are willing to speak about their experiences and share them with the visitors (readers) of the library. The main goals of such initiative are to highlight stereotypes, prejudices and negative consequences that exist in a certain society; to provide personal contact with diversity in a safe place; to raise awareness of the situation of socially stigmatized groups; to encourage a dialogue based on respect of human rights; to problematize and highlight the everyday reality of members of socially stigmatized groups, e.g. (women, Roma people, LGBT, migrants); and to promote a constructive and productive dialogue between the various partners who constitute civil society.

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

The Human Library presents an innovative method of active dialogue which raises awareness and helps to educate on the topics of human values, human rights and encourages debate on prejudices and stereotypes in society. It reinforces recognition of professional skills and visibility of refugees among members of local population in the city of Maribor. The project facilitates a culinary, language, knowledge and experience exchange between the representatives of the refugee community and Slovene nationals. By including members of the refugee community into certain activities of the practise, such as catering and story-telling, the project is able to help raise awareness about that community.
