

REGIONAL IMPACT

POSITIVE LABOUR MARKET INTEGRATION ATTRIBUTES IN PARMA:

- Chain of services that promote the reception of refugees in small apartments that encourage interaction with the local population and reduce isolation.
- Implementation of devices and an integration team that guides the integration paths of refugees after the reception phase.
- Willingness of refugee communities to perform volunteer work and be involved in public utility activities.
- A bottom-up approach that allows for the creation of best practices in which the local community is committed to fostering better integration.
- Various foreign businesses and local associations that can facilitate the entry of refugees into the labour market and further societal participation.
- Involvement of the University of Parma with a structured plan that entails the programming of work plans, actions and projects.

- Adequate and acknowledge documentation
- Acquisition of basic skills
- Understanding the bureaucratic landscape of Parma
- Education
- Precarious housing social exclusion by dominant population

EMPOWERMENT DIMENSION To increase socio-political capabilities & access to resources for refugees


