Summary description of the pilot action (including investment, if applicable) explaining its experimental nature, demonstration character and transnational added value



The ageing of the population and the increasing number of seniors who will need support with daily activities so that they can remain in their home environment and, on the other hand, the lack of human and financial resources for this care brings concerns to society, but these can be reduced by applying ICT tools to care. Integration of care, especially in countries such as the Czech Republic where health and social care are strongly separated, can also help to address the lack of financial and human resources.

As part of the project we have developed a simple solution which we have tested in this work package. The aim was to find out whether frail elderly people would be willing to work with technology and also how healthcare professionals on both sides of the process of organising and implementing home healthcare for people discharged from hospital would approach this solution. During the testing process, we also gradually modified the application to maximize time savings for physicians.

During the pilot, we worked with ten patients, their attending physicians, and their professional home care nurses. The general experience was that patients do not want to take responsibility for organising their care, so they are happy to hand over this responsibility to their relatives or hospital staff. On the other hand, the health professionals were happy to work with the tool without any problems.

Another objective, an added value, was to outline the possibilities of integrated care in the conditions of the Czech Republic to health professionals and to demonstrate practically what benefits this integration of care would bring.

The pilot was to be carried out in cooperation with the lead partner of the project, who was to test our tool in the conditions of the Slovak Republic in Bratislava. We provided this partner with all the prerequisites to use our tool, trained the GP they were working with in its use and solved her technical difficulties, but we never received any report from the partner on the pilot implementation or data to work with. So we had no choice but to work only with the results obtained in the testing at the hospital in Olomouc.

Expected impact and benefits of the pilot action for the concerned territory and target groups and leverage of additional funds (if applicable)

The **expected result** of the pilot action is whether the Care for Frail is accepted by the special group of patiens - frail elderly and also if it is a functional solution for professionals - saves them time by easing the administrative burden.

The **following (person) groups benefit in particular** from the implementation of the Monitoring Grid:

- Politics, society: Relief of the health system from administrative burden
- *Elderlies:* their care is organised remotely, eliminating the need to visit a doctor and home care agency with paper documents
- *Doctors/ Professionals/ Follow-up treatments*: their administrative burden is reduced and they have more time for professional work.

So far, the pilot action has not yet led to an **uptake at policy or institutional level**. The next step will be to develop a local action plan, which, among other things, should also contain steps for a possible implementation in Olomouc region or Czech Republic. This will be presented to important representatives of politics in the course of the trainings and thematic meetings.

Sustainability of the pilot action results and transferability to other territories and stakeholders

The Care for Frail is a web application, which after translation in the respective language and adaptation to legal and social conditions, can be easily **transferred to other territories**, due to its ease of use.
